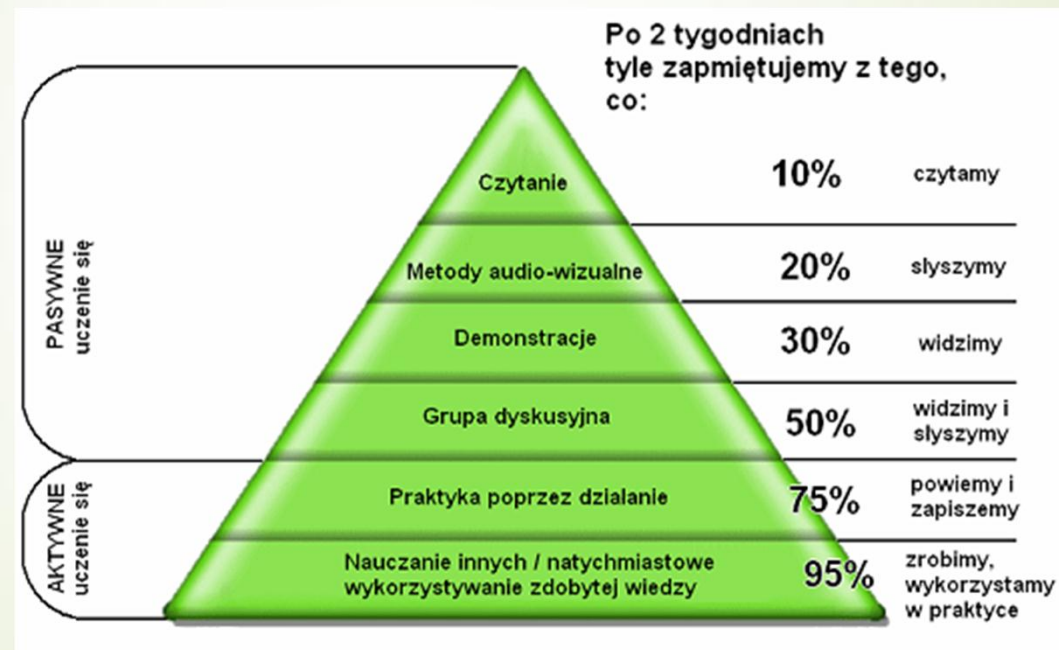

- Effective learning is one of the key skills of the future.
- **The Cone of Learning** was developed in 1969 by **Edgar Dale**. It is curious that it is still not taught in schools today.

Effective learning



The ability to collect and select information, put them in appropriate contexts and use them in practice.



Ineffective reading

- After two weeks, we remember 10% of what we read.
- **Replace the book with an audiobook.** Thanks to this, you will remember 20% of the content, which means that your learning effectiveness will increase by 100%.

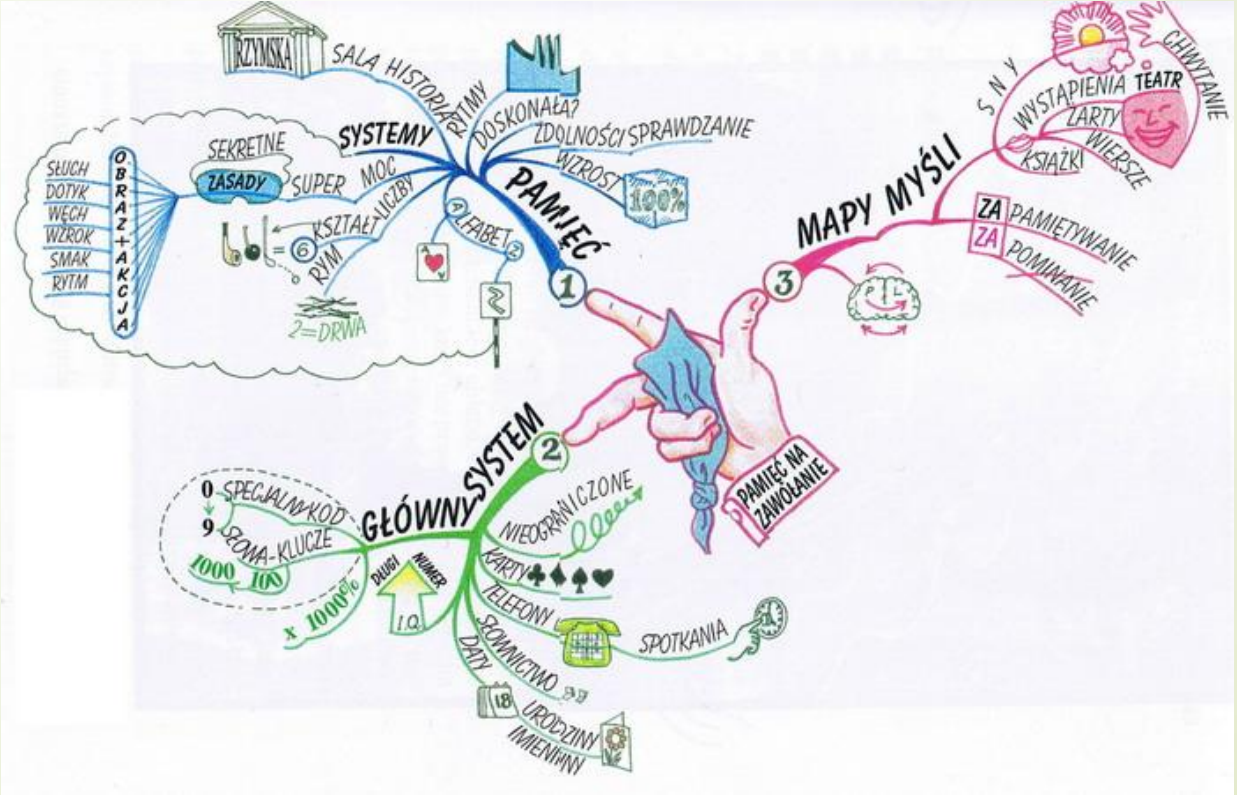


Use images

- ▶ One picture is worth 1000 words. So use infographics - combine text with drawings.
- ▶ After two weeks, we will remember 50% of what we heard and saw.

Learn actively

- ▶ Activity will allow you to reach the threshold of 70%. By participating in a discussion, you stimulate your brain in a completely different way.



Let them touch and see

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- You will be a more effective seller if you give your client a chance to experience and remember what you have to offer



Introduce physical activity

- ▶ Doing and saying something is the most effective memorising method that will allow you to remember 90% of information
- ▶ We might not remember all physics and chemical equations and all world capitals. However, we do remember how to play basketball!
